

Cambridge-McKinley Park

park information:

C.M. Brown gave the City of Cambridge 20 acres east of Lake Lavonia to be used as a park on April 25, 1887, if the town would clean it up. Citizens jumped at the chance, cleaned it up and organized the Park Association. We now have a park board and foundation that are very active.

In the park area we have 1 1/2 miles of walking trail with several unique bridges that cross Medicine Creek, two shelter houses as well as two sets of bathrooms (one with showers), two ball fields, two areas with playground equipment, a wetland area, a beautiful flower garden, several bronze sculptures, an eighteen hole Cross Creek Golf Links, disc golf course, splash pad and public pool.

The park has no time limit but is better seen during the daylight hours. Our RV Park camping area is recommended; 3 days free. Donations are accepted. Learn more at cambridgene.org.

camping amenities: There are 11 RV camp sites with electricity only. Water and dump station are available. During non freezing months the bathhouse is open.

activities: Find fun things to do at www.negpp.org under "Activities."

directions: Take the south entrance to our park off Hwy 6 and 34 next to Medicine Creek on the east side of Cambridge.



clue: Head north of the south shelter house that has horse swings on east side. The walking path is just next to the post.

distance: Parking can be north and south of where the post is located.

surface: May have to walk in grass or gravel road to the paved walking path.
