

Gordon-Winship Park

park information: The village of Gordon was incorporated in 1885, the same year that the Cowboy Rail Line was extended through the area. The village of Gordon purchased Winship Park from the Pioneer Town Site Company on July 24, 1903, for \$150.00.

In 1920, Gordon became a city with a population of 1,200. In the 1940s a band director was hired to do concerts in the park every summer. The Tri-State Cowboy Museum was moved here in 1969 and has called Winship Park home ever since.

Winship Park is approximately three acres. A new playground set was installed in Winship Park in the Fall of 2015. Winship Park is the host of Gordon's annual Willow Tree Festival.

Winship Park is also just south of Wayland Park, an 11-acre park with the Gordon Municipal Swimming Pool, a picnic shelter, and tennis courts.

All Gordon City Parks have free admission and are open from dawn to dusk. For more information, check out the parks website, www.gordon-ne.us.
