

Nebraska State Capitol

park information: The Nebraska State Capitol is a Nationally Registered Historic Landmark which houses the government of Nebraska and tells the state's story through its artwork and symbolism. The Capitol was constructed between 1922 and 1932 and is 400 feet tall.

Hours are M-F, 8 a.m.-5 p.m.; on Saturdays and holidays from 10 a.m.-5 p.m.; and on Sundays from 1-5. Free tours are offered M-F at 9, 10, and 11 am; and at 1, 2, 3 and 4 p.m. Tours are offered on Saturdays and holidays at 10 and 11 a.m., and 1, 2, 3 and 4 p.m. Tours are offered on Sundays at 1, 2, 3 and 4 p.m. Tours begin at the main entrance at the top of the grand staircase at the main entrance on K Street. The accessible entrance is underneath the grand stair and accessible parking is on K Street or south of the Capitol in front of the Governor's Residence.

Visitors are welcome to walk around the Capitol on the exterior second floor promenade deck and enjoy the view of the Capitol and grounds. Visitors can take the elevators up to the 14th floor observation decks to view the city, weather permitting. Read more online at www.capitol.nebraska.gov.

directions: When approaching Lincoln from I-80 westbound, take the Downtown 9th Street exit and follow I-180 south into downtown Lincoln. Continue south on 9th St. to K St., turn left (east) and proceed 6 blocks. When approaching from I-80 eastbound, take the #403 exit U.S. 77 south, follow the expressway to Rosa Parks Way, turn left (east) and follow the parkway to the Capitol. When approaching from the southeast on Nebraska Hwy 2, proceed northwest until the 13th/14th St. intersection, turn right and travel approximately 4 miles north to J St., and turn right two blocks to the Capitol.



clue: Walk around the exterior of the Capitol to the south side of the Governor's Residence. East of the residence is a parking lot. In the northwest corner of the parking lot, in a shrub bed beside the sidewalk, you will find the post.

distance: The post is visible from the Capitol's south entrance stairs and sidewalks and is across H Street south of the Capitol.

surface: All sidewalks are wheelchair-accessible.
